Small Businesses Drive Economic Growth and Create Essential Jobs.

Small businesses employ nearly half of private sector employees.\*

These small businesses are **optimistic about their growth trajectory,** and yet they **face significant headwinds**: limited access to affordable capital, challenges hiring and retaining skilled workers, keeping pace with new technologies like artificial intelligence and the unique difficulties of operating as a small manufacturer.

According to a recent 10,000 Small Businesses Voices survey, 74% of small business owners have plans to grow and 41% expect to create new jobs.

To help them achieve their growth goals, these business owners want the federal government to:

**54%** Address inflation

40% Provide more policy certainty

**40%** Support them in offering competitive benefits

35% Increase access to affordable capital

#### Rising Costs and Access to Affordable Capital are Squeezing Small Businesses

**73%** of small business owners are concerned with their ability to access capital.

**65%** say it is not affordable for average Americans to own and operate a small business.

### Hiring Remains a Top Challenge as Small Businesses Struggle to Offer Benefits and Find Skilled Workers

**91%** of hiring small businesses are finding it difficult to recruit qualified employees.

Their top challenges are competition with larger employers on pay and benefits (63%) and a lack of qualified workers (62%).

## Al Presents a Major Opportunity for Small Businesses — But Many Still Lack the Tools and Expertise to Fully Adopt It

**72%** of small businesses are currently using artificial intelligence (AI) and nearly all (**94%**) of them say it's having a positive impact.

Yet, even among the small businesses already using AI, **45%** say a lack of technical expertise and **47%** cite difficulty choosing the right AI tools as barriers to integrating it into their businesses.

## Support America's Small Businesses: Policy Opportunities for Small Business Growth

These proposed solutions can help further propel small business growth and opportunity.

- 1 Increase access to flexible, affordable capital
  - 1. Prioritize support for small business lenders, such as Small Business Investment Companies
  - 2. Encourage lenders to adopt technological tools that will help streamline loans and application processes for small businesses
  - 3. Improve technical assistance for financing to ensure it is comprehensive and accessible
- 2. Address workforce and competitiveness challenges
  - 1. Foster greater connectivity between small businesses and community colleges that offer job and skills training programs
  - 2. Encourage the development of a benefits resource guide for small businesses
- Increase training and education resources on how artificial intelligence can support the small business workforce
  - 1. Encourage AI literacy and skill building for small businesses
  - 2. Ensure the infrastructure needed to support small business use of AI and digital tools is in place
  - 3. Give small businesses a seat at the table in stakeholder convenings to develop AI standards
- 4. Support the unique needs of small manufacturers
  - 1. Enhance capital access for small manufacturers
  - 2. Reauthorize and improve accessibility to the Small Business Innovation Research and Small Business Technology Transfer programs
- 5. Enhance government contracting opportunities
  - 1. Improve training and technical assistance that help small businesses compete for government contracts
  - 2. Increase the simplified acquisition threshold to \$250,000
